Tripping over ropes and risk of damage to ropes	Injury	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Instructors are taught to store spare rope away from areas where clients are walking.</li> <li>The importance of care of ropes is brought to the attention of the group as are the safety implications of standing on ropes.</li> </ul>	Safety brief at start of activity with guidelines on rope use.	Low
Rope burns	Injury	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All participants must wear a glove on hand controlling rope during abseil,</li> <li>these to be destroyed and disposed of when unserviceable.</li> </ul>	Safety kit provided	Low
Falling rocks	Injury, death	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All participants and instructors must wear helmets at all times during abseiling sessions</li> <li>This reduces the risk of head injury from falling objects.</li> <li>Staff must ensure helmets do not constantly require adjusting</li> </ul>	SPA instructors and assistants to check appropriate headgear worn and pre-visit site	Medium
Equipment failure	Injury, death	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Equipment to be replaced in accordance with manufacturers Recommendations. In the case of onsite ropes minimum of every</li> <li>Year replacement and off site stored ropes every 2 years. Helmets. Karabiners every 5 years.</li> <li>Stitch plates, belay devices etc to be replaced as advised by the manufacturers recommendations.</li> <li>Gear can fail due to overload – people over 18 stones carefully managed.</li> </ul>	Log of all kit, ropes used and date purchased to ensure confident replacement deadlines are in place.	Medium

Entangled in rope	Injury	Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• All long hair must be tied back and tucked inside jackets, as per</li><li>• operational procedures, all abseil pitches should have releasable abseil rope type or other proven methods of quick release.</li></ul>	Instructors to ensure participant is clothed suitable and that hair and other items that may get caught are tied away	Low
